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SUBJECT: UPDATED HEALTH PROTOCOL FOR ONSITE LEARNING

In preparation for the return of the onsite classes, please be guided by the following protocols.

1. Campus Protocol

a. Before Entry

To maximize the well-being, and health benefits for students, and to ensure a well-conceived emergency preparedness, students are required to submit the duly accomplished Medical Information Sheet online. This form can be accessed through the AIMS Portal (arellanolaw.edu). This would aid AUSL health personnel deliver the most appropriate and effective treatment and support as well as in assessing and responding to health issues when the need arises.

Rest assured that all the data gathered will be strictly confidential. Students, however, may opt not to answer certain sensitive questions.

All individuals must assure, to the best of their ability, that they are COVID-19 free, have not been exposed to potential carrier, or have not been tagged as suspect or probable case before entering the AUSL premises.

Students with fever are discouraged to attend onsite classes.

b. While inside the campus

Wearing of proper face masks indoor is optional but is highly encouraged for senior citizens, individuals who have cough and colds, are not fully vaccinated, and are immunocompromised.

Wash Hands and use Hand sanitizer frequently. Hand Sanitizers, alcohol, and liquid soaps are provided at designated areas around the campus and inside AUSL school premises.

2. Quarantine and Isolation Protocols: Refer to the table below

	Masking/Quarantine/Isolation
Asymptomatic CLOSE CONTACT exposed to confirmed COVID-19 positive individual.	 No need to quarantine; and Wear a well fitted face mask for 10 days.
Asymptomatic but CONFIRMED COVID-19 positive case	 Home Isolation for 5days OR until afebrile/Fever-free for at least 24 hrs. without using antipyretics (e.g. Paracetamol) and with improvement of respiratory symptoms Wear a well-fitted face mask for 10 days. Note: Isolation may be shortened upon the advice of your health care provider.
CONFIRMED COVID-19 positive case with mild symptoms or individual with acute respiratory symptoms.	
CONFIRMED COVID-19 positive case with moderate to severe symptoms or Immunocompromised	 Isolation for 10 days from onset of sign and symptoms following advice of the attending physician, including whether to be admitted in a health care facility. Wear a well-fitted face mask for 10 days.
	Note: For severe disease and immunocompromised, discontinue isolation only upon the advice of your healthcare provider.



Optimized ventilation as well as proper hygiene and other measures to avoid transmission risks will continue to be implemented to prevent the spread of infection in our university setting.

Whilst the state of public health emergency has already been lifted, the health sector of the AUSL shall continue to remain vigilant to ensure adequate health system capacity in the event that it is required.

Finally, updated guidelines from time to time will be issued based on the Alert Level System issued by the Department of Health and the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases.

Please be guided accordingly.
